Air pollution bingo

This simple game will help your pupils think about words associated with clean air and air pollution in the environment around them.

Ringo caller's card



Bingo instructions:

- 1. Use your bingo caller's card to call the bingo and keep track of which words have already been called.
- **2.** Print off the bingo caller's card, cut each word out and put them in a bag (or similar).
- **3.** To start the game, distribute a bingo card to each pupil.
- 4. Pull out a word from the bag and read it out loud (to make it more difficult you could read out the definition of the word instead and get the pupils to tell you what the word is).
- 5. Pupils will then look for this word on their bingo card and cross it out/cover it if they have it. You can also take time to discuss the word with the class. Repeat this with all the words in the bag until someone gets bingo.
- **6.** The pupil to cross out all of their words first shouts out 'bingo' and wins the game.

Word explanations

These are the words used in our game of air pollution bingo. The definitions will help with your classroom discussions.

#brumbreathes

Smog

Smog, is a type of intense air pollution. It is a fog that is worsened by smoke or other pollutants. This term was first created during the Industrial Revolution. Do remember, just because you can't see air pollution doesn't mean it's not there.

Cycling

A popular form of active travel, cycling reduces air pollution by cutting down on greenhouse gas emissions.

Traffic

Traffic is one of the major sources of air pollutants.

Pollution

Anything that makes the earth dirty and unhealthy. Land, air, and water are all affected by pollution.

Climate change

Climate change describes a change in the average conditions such as temperature and rainfall in a region over a long period of time.

Asthma

A common lung condition that causes occasional breathing problems which may be worsened by the impacts of air pollution.

Running engines

Leaving a car engine running when the car is not moving, this releases polluting emissions into the environment.

CO₂

Carbon dioxide is a compound made up of carbon and oxygen. In the atmosphere, carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas. High levels of CO2 contribute to climate change.

Recycling

The process of converting waste into reusable material. Recycling saves lots of energy and water. Recycling prevents the emissions of many greenhouse gases and water pollutants, and saves energy.

Fumes

A smoke, vapor, or gas. Car engines release fumes.

Plants

Plants clean the air through the process of photosynthesis. They absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen.

Lungs

A vital organ in the chest that supplies the body with oxygen and removes carbon dioxide from the body. Breathing in air pollutants can cause damage to our lungs.

Air

A mixture of nitrogen, oxygen, and small amounts of other gases that surrounds the earth and forms its atmosphere.

Walking


When choosing walking over other modes of transport, the number of harmful emissions created and released into the atmosphere are significantly reduced.

Cars

They are one of the biggest sources of pollution in the UK, contributing to poor air quality, noise disturbance, congestion and climate change.




This is a fun form of active travel. It keeps our streets free from congestion and is good for the environment.
