Persuasive letter writing (KS2)



Learning Objectives

- To learn more about the benefits of Switch Off School Streets (SOSS) please visit birmingham.gov.uk/ switchofftoolkit
- To write a persuasive letter to make parents/carers aware of SOSS and why it is needed.

Introduction

- Tell the pupils that your school is implementing a Switch Off campaign, and why we need to convince parents/carers that it's important.
- Tell pupils that one way to have power over an issue is to voice your opinion. Their goal is to convince others of their opinion and defend it.

Background

- Have a class discussion about the positives and negatives of implementing SOSS. Supporting information can be found in the SOSS toolkit at birmingham.gov.uk/ switchofftoolkit
- You can split the positives into different categories (e.g. Health, Environment, Social, Economic).
- Get the pupils to choose 3/4
 positives that they think are
 most powerful as being the main
 arguments in their letter.
- Think about your reader...
 Would they have any questions
 about SOSS? What would these be?
 What would make parents/carers
 not want to get involved with
 the scheme? Think of answers

to these questions and counterarguments.

Differentiation - Support

- Provide a template for the letter, including designated blanks or lines for the date, greeting, body, salutation and signature.
- Find an example of a persuasive letter or essay online. Look at how arguments are structured and analyse the language used.

Enrichment

- Ask pupils to find data or other evidence that would support their arguments. This could include getting quotes from people who are affected by the issue.
- Invite pupils to type their letters out on the computer.

 Send parents/carers the SOSS pledge which they can sign and return to display they will be making changes.


